From the Head of School

Soon we will begin registration for our 50th school year. What a wonderful milestone to celebrate! By the end of the first week of March, you should have received your registration packet for next year. If you have not received registration information, please call our School office at 851-6292, and we will be happy to mail you a packet. Registration for current School students and our congregation members begins on Monday, March 14. Registration opens to the public on Monday, March 21. If your child currently attends and you plan for your child to return next year, I strongly encourage you to take advantage of the advance registration during the week of March 14 -18 to reserve placement for your child. Students who are returning to Gloria Dei for the 2022- 2023 school year need to re-register, as this is a yearly process.

Each year's program builds a foundation to enable students to grow with sequential skill development to the next grade level. As a child moves from one grade level to another, the programs expand to offer a broader base of activities and enriching experiences.

Children in our Toddler/2-year-old classes are able to enroll for a full-day program beginning with the summer program. Children have a positive, first-school experience while enjoying activities, art projects, games, music, library, and chapel. Students must be at least 16 months old on their entrance date to attend.

At the preschool level, we offer a half-day school program with the option of hourly or full-time childcare before and/or after school if needed. Preschoolers enjoy weekly themed units, introduction to the alphabet and phonics, counting and numbers, art, children's literature, learning games, music, chapel, physical education, and library. Preschool gives children the opportunity to develop friendships, to learn to resolve conflicts, and to grow socially as well as academically. Preschoolers need to be potty-trained to attend and three years old by December 31, 2022.

Students moving from preschool to prekindergarten experience pre-reading activities with *Handwriting Without Tears*, *Word* - a language development program, *Scholastic News*, *Mortimer Moose* - an alphabet and phonics program, and *Handwriting Without Tears*, *Math*. Along with many classroom activities and games, children enjoy weekly P.E., music, chapel, library, and participate in a hands-on science experience in their science class. Every other week, prekindergarten students learn about

nutrition with Chef Combo and visit the computer lab to work with educational software.

Kick Start Kindergarten is geared for students who are age appropriate for kindergarten but who are not quite ready, for children who are repeating prekindergarten, or for advanced children entering prekindergarten. In order for preschool students to be eligible for this program, they need to pass a screening and have a teacher recommendation.

All kindergarten classes learn reading with a phonetic program, *Beginning to Read, Write and Listen* by Macmillan/McGraw-Hill. What an exciting time when your kindergartener reads to you for the first time! In the fall of 2020, the kindergarten program relocated to the Willow Oaks campus. The addition of kindergarten to our elementary facility set the tone for a more academic focus to the kindergarten program.

The Willow Oaks campus has all the essentials needed for elementary-age students - computer lab, library, art/music room, science room, P.E. athletic field, playground, infirmary, and offices. The grades' program builds strong academic skills in phonetics and reading comprehension, spelling, math, and writing while offering an enriching resource schedule - weekly art classes, extended computer time, P.E., Spanish, along with chapel, library, music, chorus, and S.T.E.M. science lab.

Our middle school is also located at our Willow Oaks Campus. We continue with our strong tradition of academic excellence in a Christian environment with an emphasis on the mental, spiritual, physical, emotional, and social needs of students. Students change classes for the core subjects of literature, grammar, composition, math, science, and social studies. In addition, a well-rounded program of resources will provide enrichment. Resources, depending on grade level, include health, study skills, conflict resolution, physical education, art, project design, CSI, geography, computers, photography, Lego Robotics, Stop Motion Animation, woodworking, sewing, chapel, library, music, and MORE. Algebra I, Geometry, and Spanish I are offered for transfer as high school credits.

It is amazing what our students can accomplish with a strong academic curriculum, enriching resource classes, a spiritual foundation which reinforces values and morals, a nurturing, caring environment, and a partnership between home and school. Today, more than ever before, it is vital for students to not only have a solid, firm, educational foundation, but also a foundation for moral and ethical standards. Children learn and practice values and standards by example and guidance. The experiences and environment you are providing for your child now will influence your child for a lifetime. We welcome the opportunity to be a part of your child's life journey.

Boy Scouts

Troop 84 and the church completed our annual recharter for 2022, with some specific conditions. With that, it is important that I share some facts about our situation with the congregation.

In its current form, BSA Troop 84 will operate only for two more years.

Throughout the history of Troop 84's partnership with Gloria Dei, congregation members have been exceedingly generous with their time, encouragement, and financial support for service projects, trips, Eagle Scout applications, and mentoring. Unfortunately, the Scouting BSA national organization and local membership challenges resulting from COVID-19, have placed us in an unsustainable situation.

The proposed bankruptcy settlement between BSA, claimants, and insurance creditors puts chartered organizations like Gloria Dei in positions of increased financial risk from future lawsuits. The ELCA advised individual congregations to assess their risk and adequately insure themselves should they choose to continue supporting Scouting. After carefully researching church's options with its insurer, it was concluded that the best way forward to protect the School and Church would be to charter **ONLY existing scouts and adult leaders**. Since the onset of difficulties from COVID-19, the troop's membership has declined to four active youth (Jake, Oliver, Josh, and Gabe), only one of whom is a congregation member. Three of these scouts will turn 18 ("age out") by the end of 2023. Further, the Cub Scout pack (184) went dormant in Spring 2020, effectively shutting our pipeline of new scouts. A successful troop functions under the "Patrol Method" which needs 8-10 scouts to truly be effective; we're obviously below that. The new conditions, do not allow us to recruit new members. However, the current members are of sufficient rank that our small size is less critical to their progression. There is sizeable benefit for them to complete their scouting experience with Troop 84 versus transitioning their advancement records to another troop and establishing new relationships with scouts and leadership.

Despite the low numbers, our scouts have actively participated in a strong program. We returned to active camping as soon as state COVID restrictions allowed, hiking and camping at places like Crabtree Falls and Sherando Lake. Scouts attended summer camp, earning lots of merit badges. And they continue to organize service projects such as Grandview Beach cleanup, Gosnold's Hope Park conservation, and building/placing an Osprey Nest platform in Elizabeth Lake. Under the conditions of this charter arrangement, the church pledges to support the existing members until they achieve Eagle Scout rank, age out, or choose to transition to another troop. The legacy of past participants means we have ample equipment and resources to support activities.

Scouting presents youth fun and enriching opportunities to build faith, community, and lives. I am thankful to the council and congregation for finding a way to continue supporting these young men.
