A Word from Our Pastor

The Fox's Trot

My paternal grandmother, I called her Mamaw Fox (saying that name still brings a smile to my face) and others knew her as Betty, was a woman who had very little. She never moved from the property on which she was born. My grandfather worked for the local prison as a guard. Mamaw stayed at home as a homemaker. She would make cakes and pies advertising them on the radio (B86 a local AM station) during the Swap Shop hour. They had been foster parents for many children. Adopted my uncle. And about a year after adopting, they had my dad. A one-income family with multiple children was not easy. And what made it more difficult was the fact that my grandfather was an alcoholic. I never saw him that way, because he was sober by the time I came into the world. With Papaw being an alcoholic, Mamaw had to oversee the finances to make sure the family could survive. She made sure all of the children under her roof had plenty to eat. And let me say that even as a grandma, she had all of her cupboards packed with food. After my grandfather died, Mamaw lived on her monthly Social Security check and nothing more. Every month, she cut a check to her church. It wasn't much, but it was the best she could do. She was also quick to help out those in need, giving generously to the cause. Anytime Mamaw could give, she did it joyfully and generously.

Many folks do not give away their money, because there is always some excuse or the feeling of scarcity. I've heard from many people in my ministry, "We're on a budget." I don't know if you know this, but we are all on a budget – from my Mamaw to Jeff Bezos. You say you had house repairs and needed to purchase a newer car, so after you pay for those things you will give. You just had a child and we all know how much a child costs, so after their expenses we can give. You had some medical thing

happen, and you are set back another year or two from giving. You are saving for retirement; otherwise, you would think about giving. You are retired and don't draw the same income you once did, so giving is now out of the picture. If you live in a mindset of scarcity, you will never have enough. If you understand that you are enough and that you have enough, you have received the blessing of joy through being generous.

A friend and colleague of mine had a parishioner who always complained about money. He didn't have enough money. The church needed to stick with the same budget from when he was a kid, because he thought they didn't have enough money. Money was just an ill subject for him. Thinking the way he did about money made him a miserable person. My friend confronted him and told him about his unhealthy relationship with money. He told him he needed to start giving away his money. parishioner baulked at this idea, saying he didn't have enough money to give away. My colleague assured him that if he started giving away his money, he would truly see how much he does have. For the first time in his life, the man began to give to support the mission and ministry of his church. At first, it was equivalent to what my grandmother on Social Security would give; but as time went on, he became more generous. After one year of giving to his church, he called up the pastor and thanked him for opening his eyes and heart to living out of abundance. He had been stuck in scarcity but was freed to the joyous life of giving generously.

We will do our stewardship appeal, *Cultivating Generosity*, this January and February. You will hear impact stories from within and outside of our congregation. You will be reminded of the powerful ministry that takes place through the people of Gloria Dei. And you will be encouraged to increase your current giving or be asked to give for the very first time. For many it will be uncomfortable to think about money; but for those who have been generous givers, it will be a great opportunity to share out of the abundance with that which Christ has blessed you. Let's cultivate generosity at Gloria Dei; planting the seeds that we are enough and that we have enough; weeding out the notion that we live in scarcity; watering generously with our lives of abundance.

There is joy in giving generously. I saw it with Mamaw. I heard it through the point of view of my friend and colleague. I am witnessing it with you.

Musical Musings

¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; 20 but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. 21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

I'm writing this newsletter article right before Christmas; and I'm acutely aware that, in addition to this word processing document, I have several browser windows open for different online retailers with various Christmas presents tagged for consideration. Every year I declare I'm going to do Christmas more simply; and somehow I get caught up in the frenzy of wanting to make sure it is grand enough to meet some unwritten, but deeply ingrained expectations.

Jesus tells us time and again that what really matters is not investment in material wealth—some supposed "wow" factor to impress our friends or family-but the wealth of the kingdom of God. The gifts Jesus praises the most are often the smallest: the widow who brought just two copper coins to the Temple for her offering (Mark 12), for instance. In the grand scheme of things, her offering was small; but to the widow, those coins made up most of her earthly wealth.

Christian poetry and prose also emphasize that the gifts most noticed by God seem to be the smallest. From the third stanza of "In the Bleak Midwinter" by Christina Rossetti:

-Hinny

What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb. If I were a wise man, I would do my part. *Yet what I can I give him—give my heart.*

And we all know the story of The Little Drummer Boy, who sees the fine gifts laid beside the baby Jesus and is overcome with a desire to give all he can. In this case, a song on his drum:

Come, they told me, a new born king to see. Our finest gifts we bring to lay before the king. I have no gift to bring...Shall I play for you? Mary nodded, I played my drum. Then he smiled at me, pa rum pum pum pum. Me and my drum.

The smallest gifts attract the most attention from Jesus, but it is not just that they are small but that they represent such overflowing generosity on the part of the giver. To be clear, for those who have much, Jesus expects much. To the rich young ruler asking for eternal life (Matthew 19), Jesus says, "Go, sell everything you have, and come follow me." Even when he was just a small child, Jesus accepted lavish gifts from the three wise men: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. "Those to whom much is given, much will be expected," Jesus later said. (Luke 12).

To those of us who give all, Jesus does not leave us empty-handed. By handing over our greatest treasures to God, we receive the gift of knowing that we have invested in something greater than ourselves. Unlike the rich young ruler in Matthew 19 who goes home and, presumably, lives out his life alone with his fine things, we who invest in building a community of welcome and love—in other words, God's kingdom-will be blessed in kind. The riches God has in store for us, both here on earth and in eternity, are far greater than anything in my online shopping basket this Christmas.
