

## The Fox's Trot

September can be more a month of beginnings than January. Honestly, when I had a bound calendar, I preferred one that was based on the school schedule rather than the January to December schedule. January really only marks a new year. There are no new starts, unless you are joining a gym. September, however, offers the beginning of a new school year, new shoes, fall sports, church programs, and much more. At Gloria Dei, this fall, we are about to begin a spread of ministries and fellowship opportunities.

Wonderful Wednesdays will begin after Labor Day. We had a great time last year with about 20 kids each week, along with many adult volunteers. When I first envisioned Wonderful Wednesdays at Gloria Dei, I wanted this to be a ministry for all ages. For the first six-weeks I will be teaching an adult class (Reclaiming Revelation) while Rita and Sharon teach Confirmation. Rita will teach an adult class, the semester after that. And in January, Sharon will begin an adult class geared towards handiwork.

On Sunday, September 11, at 4:00 p.m., I will begin a monthly gathering in the Fellowship Hall for Laughter Yoga. I've been thinking about this a lot lately. I cannot wait to bring the joy of Laughter Yoga to the city of Hampton. Remember to invite your friends and neighbors.

September 18, is Bring a Friend to Church Sunday. Our goal is for each of us to invite three people. Maybe you've never asked anyone to join you in worship. This Sunday is the best time to ask them, because following worship the youth are serving a brunch to raise money. So, you don't have to take your friends out to eat after worship. Rather, you'll just take them down the hall to enjoy great food and have meaningful conversation.

Also coming in September is B90 (Bible in 90 Days). Printed in your bulletins and in this newsletter are a schedule, for those who wish to participate, to read the entire Bible in 90 days. For some, this may be your very first time reading the Bible from cover to cover. For others, it will be like revisiting an old friend and yet learning something new each day.

Coming this fall, I will be doing a seven-week course called God and Family for both Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts (Grades 4-5). You do not need to be in Scouts to attend, so if

interested, please call me to sign up your child. (Do this sooner, rather than later.) These will take place on Sunday afternoons and should bring in children from our local scouting groups. When people ask me what this is about, I tell them it is about pizza. Each week's theme is connected to how you bake a pizza, but focuses on your role in your family as well as in God's family.

We will also begin our stewardship drive this fall. Though we don't usually like talking about how we spend our time, talent, and money (especially the money), it is important for us to support the ministries that stem out of Gloria Dei. This year we hope to inspire you with generosity stories and ideas on where our increased giving could make Gloria Dei even better than what it is today.

There are plenty of things that are not new to Gloria Dei that you can read about in this newsletter. If it has your attention, for even just a moment, give it a chance. It may be just what you need in your life.

Whether you are starting something new or restarting something you use to do, it can, at first, be filled with anxiety. However, once we jump in and get started, we quickly figure out that this new thing is worth the time and the energy. Here's the number one tip in starting something new, especially with the church: focus on the relationships more than the event. Let me say that again. Focus on the relationships more than the event. I know they taught you the opposite in school, but how well did that work? The people that you gather with are the most important part of anything we do, aside from your relationship with and worshipping our Triune God, at Gloria Dei. Sure, you will learn something; you will grow; you will change; but, the most important part is doing it with others.

I sure do hope to see both new faces and the regulars at these upcoming firsts at Gloria Dei. Blessings in these new beginnings.

### From the Head of School

As the school year begins, many parents are often worried because children sometimes experience separation anxiety as they begin a new school year or begin school for the first time. Change, even when it is a good change, is anxiety producing. Separation anxiety is a child's way of expressing that it is difficult to say good-bye. Most preschoolers, and sometimes even elementary students, will experience this anxiety at some point in their lives. Sometimes it occurs unexpectedly after a change in the environment or routine. Other times separation anxiety occurs because children are worried about events or happenings at home – a parent may be deployed, there may be an illness in the family, or the death of a family member. These events can leave a child feeling insecure. Usually, however, separation anxiety is a "missing mom or dad" issue.

Listed below are some suggested tips that may be useful to help minimize the problem. Sometimes it may take up to two weeks before you begin to see improvement. Don't panic, hang in there. Be positive with your child about his/her school experience and this stage will soon be over.

**DO:** Keep your good-byes **short and sweet**. In doing so, you let your child know that you have confidence in your child's ability to cope and that you know he/she will be okay. You trust that he/she will be in good hands.

**DON'T:** Hover around making the good-byes long and drawn out. This tends to make you and your child more upset. Your child will sense your anxiety, and this will make it more difficult for him/her to calm down.

**DO:** Develop loving good-bye routines. Walk your child to the classroom, where you can say good-bye and get a hug. Then let your child enter the classroom. If needed, let the teacher take your child.

**DON'T:** Bargain or bribe your child to behave. This sets the stage for expecting additional bargains and bribes for behavior expectations.

**DO:** Send clear messages. Your child needs to know that you expect him/her to go to school no matter how much he/she fusses, cries, or throws a temper tantrum.

**DON'T:** Take your child home. If you do, you send the message that if your child cries enough he/she won't have to stay. Taking your child home will usually only prolong anxiety.

**DO:** Invite children from the class over so your child can develop friendships that will make the transition easier.

**DON'T:** Get upset. By keeping an upbeat and positive attitude about school, teachers, and friends, you'll help your child feel safe and enjoy his/her time at school.

**DO:** Ask your spouse or another family member to take a turn dropping off, or pick up one of your child's classmates on the way to school, and your problems may disappear immediately.

**DON'T:** Discuss problems with the teacher in the morning. Save conversations and questions for the end of the day or a phone call. Try not to discuss problems or concerns in front of your child.

**DO:** Work in partnership with the teacher and aide. Let the teacher or aide greet your child and gently guide him/her into the classroom where your child will engage in activities.

**DON'T:** Be surprised if anxiety reoccurs after holidays, sick days, or other transition periods.

**DO:** Believe in your child's ability to make positive changes.

DON'T: Sneak out. You want your child to know that he/she can trust you.

Hopefully these tips will help with smooth transitions for our new year.

Elementary and middle school classes will hold Parent Night meetings on the following dates. These meetings take place after the start of the school year, and allow teachers an opportunity to discuss classroom routines, expectations, and curriculum. These meetings are for parents only, so we ask you to make other arrangements for your children on the evening of your student's grade level meeting.

But when Preeti receives word of a terrible accident in the city where she was born, she returns to India, where she'll have to face her estranged parents...and the complicated past they left behind. Surrounded by the sights and sounds of her heritage, Preeti catches a startling glimpse of her family's battles with class, tradition, and sacrifice. Torn between two beautifully flawed cultures, Preeti must now untangle what home truly means to her.
