The Fox's Trot

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe. Hebrews 12:28, NRSV

It is easy for us to come up with reasons on why not to get up and go to worship on Sunday morning. We see it best on a rainy day. On a rainy day, people do not want to bother with getting wet in order to come to worship. However, on sunny days, peoples' minds are on other things...like hunting, fishing, boating, and sun bathing. Their mind is not on Christ; rather, it is on themselves.

People seem to think worship is something that we do to check it off of our list. I went to church this week, this month, the quarter, this year – check! With the mentality of saying that we need to go to worship in order to check it off of our "to do list," we are more apt to whittle away at the service in order to make it less "painful." With this mentality, our focus is only on ourselves. We have lost sight of Jesus, who is at the center of the throne.

It is our Triune God who deserves our worship. God deserves our unending worship; worship that involves hymns of praise, times of silence, prayer, God's Word, and Holy Communion. We should be asking ourselves, how can I be more faithful in worshiping God throughout my entire life?

We tend to make worship about fulfilling our needs. We wrongly believe that it is about what we get out of the sermon, us receiving forgiveness for our sins, and us receiving a benediction. Focusing on ourselves and focusing on our desires is sinful. When we focus on these things in our life, we are distracted from worshipping our Triune God. This distraction causes us to worship other things in our lives that are not our Triune God.

The lake, golf course, video game, and bed do not need worship because they do not deserve worship. The only thing these things provide is a bit of leisure or rest. These things, though nice, are only fulfilling for a short while. However, Jesus Christ, the slaughtered Lamb, is who deserves unending worship. It is because of his blood on the cross that we are freed from sin. It is Jesus who is victorious over death. It is Christ who is the faithful witness. It is Jesus who is alive and present with his Church. It is Jesus who will come again.

We, as human beings, were created to worship God. It is vital for us to continually worship God in all that we are and in all that we do. Worship is about our faithful participation in proclaiming all honor, praise, and glory to our amazing King of Kings, our Lord of Lords, our Savior, Jesus the Christ.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God.

After taking the summer off, the book group will once again be getting together. On **Monday, September 11, at 7:00 p.m.**, we'll gather at the home of Rita Foringer. The book selected is *Saturday Night at the Lakeside Supper Club*, by J. Ryan Stradal. This warm hug of a book about a family restaurant — and how various generations' hopes, dreams, and lives are connected to it — is a love letter to the Midwest.

Here's a synopsis: Mariel Prager needs a break. Her husband Ned is having an identity crisis; her spunky, beloved restaurant is bleeding money by the day; and her mother Florence is stubbornly refusing to leave the church where she's been holed up for more than a week. The Lakeside Supper Club has been in her family for decades; and while Mariel's grandmother embraced the business, seeing it as a saving grace, Florence never took to it. When Mariel inherited the restaurant, skipping Florence, it created a rift between mother and daughter that never quite healed.

Ned is also an heir—to a chain of home-style diners—and while he doesn't have a head for business, he knows his family's chain could provide a better future than his wife's fading restaurant. In the aftermath of a devastating tragedy, Ned and Mariel lose almost everything they hold dear, and the hard-won victories of each family hang in the balance. With their dreams dashed, can one fractured family find a way to rebuild despite their losses, and will the Lakeside Supper Club be their salvation?

In this colorful, vanishing world of relish trays and brandy, Old Fashioned J. Ryan Stradal has once again given us a story full of his signature honest, lovable yet fallible Midwestern characters as they grapple with love, loss, and marriage; what we hold onto and what we leave behind; and what our legacy will be when we are gone.

Estate Planning

You're not going to need your money when you're gone. However, you are responsible for what happens to it after you are gone. Making out a will is very important for everyone to do, both young and old. It is also important to update your will as things change and at least every ten years. If you are creating a will or updating your will consider one of two options to help in the mission of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church:

- 1. In your will you can state, "After all my bills are paid, I want 10 percent of my estate (a tithe) to go to Gloria Dei Lutheran Church."
- 2. You can make Gloria Dei Lutheran Church one of your children. By making the Church a beneficiary, meaning if you have two biological children, your estate would be split equally to your now three children one third to Harvely, one third to Marvely, and one third to Gloria Dei Lutheran Church.

Thank you for thinking and planning long term for our church's future. Ensuring this is in your will, ensures that a plan is in place to help spread the gospel of Jesus to those that come after you.




