I learned generosity from my parents and grandparents who provided what I needed and were generous in providing for my education including music. I learned about stewardship in my confirmation classes and more from my pastors.

I support Gloria Dei with my time, funding, and modest talent; because I am happy to be a part of its ministries. I know everything good that we have comes from God. Our church building and grounds, of course, are not the Church. The people are the Church. Nevertheless, the buildings and grounds are needed for our shelter and comfort. We depend upon the Pastor and staff for our worship and community. The organ provides music to the glory of God. All of these require our generosity.

It is my hope that Gloria Dei will continue to grow as a congregation and continue to be a blessing to the community. We all have been blessed. I would like to see more ethnic diversity and community outreach.
