

#### The Fox's Trot

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind—just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you— so that you are not lacking in any gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.—1 Corinthians 1:4-8

I am thankful for each of you. I am blessed to know you and to walk alongside you through your life's journey. Many of you have shared difficult matters that you have faced or are still facing; how honored I am that you would share those things with me. You have shared your joys with me, too – and I rejoice with you in you and/or your family's accomplishments.

In our Youth Discipleship Ministries, including Confirmation, we do what we call Highs and Lows. It is an opportunity for our youth to share the best part of their week and the worst part of their week. I truly think that for some this is the highlight of their time together; mainly because they feel heard. It is expected that the adults share their highs and lows like everyone else. When it is my turn I have a different high for the week; however, I always state the same low: "There are not enough hours in the day and not enough days in the week." I was questioned by one of our Confirmands on why I always say the same thing. And you all know me well enough that I don't sugarcoat things. My response was: "Because people don't want to hear that their pastor, or any leader for that matter, has anything negative going on in their lives. It's not that we don't. It's just that we know that folks really don't want to hear those things about us."

Though my response is true, my initial low is equally as true. There isn't enough time. Even if I live to see one hundred years, I would feel that I did not have enough

time to accomplish all that I wished to accomplish. This is another reason why I have so much to be thankful for concerning you, people of Gloria Dei. Our Eucharistic Ministers visit our shut-ins faithfully, knowing that I can't do it on my own. Our Stewards Ministry knows that I have ten thumbs and anytime a need arises at the church, they are here to tear down or build up. I have so many great leaders and teachers who I come in contact with through our staff and volunteers and am ever grateful for our shared ministries together. My staff does strong work picking up all of the daily administrative tasks that need to be tended to. Though I have so many folks sharing in the ministry here at Gloria Dei, I still wish there were more hours in the day and more days in the week.

The one thing I wish I could do more of with each of you is sharing a meal together. Jesus spent a lot of his time eating with those around him. So, in order to fulfill this shortfall in my ministry here at Gloria Dei, I am beginning a new ministry called Suppers at Capri. In 2025, we will have monthly meals at our friend Joe's restaurant, Capri Pizza and Italian Restaurant. The reason for "Suppers" is because not only will we share supper together, but during our time together, we will also share the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion). Our conversations will be centered around Scripture, also knowing that you're going to want to share what's going on in your life. Invite your friends and family. This is very much about the church being the church outside of our campuses. You can read the rest of the newsletter to find out the details of January's Suppers at Capri.

I am thankful for a new opportunity to connect with all of you. Each of you are a gift. Each of you are loved. I can't wait to see you again as we work together in sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with our neighborhoods and our world.

## **Spanish Class**

Why take a foreign language? Beginning a foreign language at an early age contributes to brain development and overall learning. Foreign language study improves cognitive skills and academic performance. Learning a foreign language also opens doors to other cultures and makes an individual a better world citizen.

The students at Gloria Dei Lutheran School are fortunate to be able to take Spanish from an early age, and they learn about Spanish language and Hispanic culture using a variety of activities.

Each quarter, the students learn vocabulary words from the "Let's Learn Spanish" series by Hayes School Publishing Company. The purpose of this series is to encourage children to learn a foreign language while having fun. The study of Hispanic culture and the geography of countries where Spanish is spoken is also an important element in the Spanish curriculum. Each Spanish-speaking country contributes its distinctive culture to the multifaceted Spanish-speaking

world, and the Gloria Dei students learn about the individual countries and the children who live in them. Each elementary class concentrates on a different country each quarter.

During fall festival week, the children learned about the Day of the Dead. They viewed beautiful images of the holiday, listened to music regarding the holiday, and colored drawings inspired by Mexican folklore. Taken from stained glass designs, the images depict animals, religious icons, and other images related to Day of the Dead traditions.

Spanish continues at Gloria Dei in the Middle School. The sixth-grade Spanish class meets during the Spring Semester. This class introduces the students to Spanish with an interactive web-based curriculum. The seventh and eighth grade Spanish classes are elective core courses and they are academically challenging. If the student completes Spanish 1A & 1B with success, he or she can earn high school credit. I am very proud of the students who have chosen to take these rigorous classes.

It is wonderful to see how each student learns and progresses from year to year. I strive to be a better teacher every day and I am thankful to have the opportunity to teach and learn from the children. As Thanksgiving approaches, may we all be thankful for God's many gifts.

#### **Council Corner**

#### The Light of the World

While recently visiting my family in Alaska, they had an early snow storm, which left 16" of snow behind. I was up early one night and the dark house was illuminated by a breathtaking ethereal light. There was no visible moon, but the snow beautifully reflected its light. During our Christmas season, we hear a lot about Christ being the light of the world.

Gerard van Honthorst was a Dutch painter (1592-1656) who became known for the artificial lighting in his works. When looking at images of the nativity, I happened to come across his painting of the birth of Christ, "Adoration of the Christ Child" (1619-1621). What a simple, yet beautiful portrayal of the Christ child. It is all about the light of Christ. As you look at the painting, the only light source emanates from the Christ child. Mary's and the angels' faces are brightly illuminated by the reflection of this light coming from Christ. This is the promise God made to us; you, me, everyone. If you look closely, you can see Joseph looking over Mary's shoulder. When I reflected on this image, I thought what a proud father he is. I think God must have felt the same way, looking down at the son He sent to us in the form of a vulnerable and helpless baby. God's love for us is on full display in this image.

I thought about how I take the imagery of light for granted. How many times do I think I am alone in the "darkness," because I don't remember the "light" that I long for is Christ and His promise to always be with me? The love of God through Christ is reflected in all of us, just like the figures in this painting. During this Christmas season and the calmness (sometimes the letdown) of January, look for examples of light throughout your day, and use them as a reminder of God's love for us. How can you reflect this light of love to others you encounter, and share with them the wonderful news of God's love for us?

#### The Christmas Spirit:

As a bartender, Hank serves a much different customer base at his family-owned tavern, including a handful of lonely regulars and the local biker gang.

When Peter scoffs that Hank has it easy compared to him, the two decide to switch jobs until Christmas Eve. To their surprise, the responsibilities of a bartender and a pastor are similar, but taking on the other's work is more difficult than either Peter or Hank expected. As the two begin to see each other in a new light--and each discovers a new love to cherish--their lives are forever changed.

#### **Tell Me Everything:**

It's autumn in Maine, and the town lawyer Bob Burgess has become enmeshed in an unfolding murder investigation, defending a lonely, isolated man accused of killing his mother. He has also fallen into a deep and abiding friendship with the acclaimed writer Lucy Barton, who lives down the road in a house by the sea with her ex-husband, William. Together, Lucy and Bob go on walks and talk about their lives, their fears and regrets, and what might have been. Lucy, meanwhile, is finally introduced to the iconic Olive Kitteridge, now living in a retirement community on the edge of town. They spend afternoons together in Olive's apartment, telling each other stories.
