A Word from Our Pastor

The Fox's Trot

In the middle of May, I had the honor of serving as a spiritual director on a Women's Emmaus weekend. Though Emmaus comes through a Methodist movement, it is truly an ecumenical endeavor—bringing together people from a variety of Christian backgrounds to learn more deeply about God's grace. A church that professes faith in the "one holy and apostolic church" must spend time engaging with other expressions of Christianity.

As spiritual directors, we each give talks focused on a particular aspect of God's grace. My talk was titled *Obstacles to a Grace-Filled Life*. The greatest obstacle to grace, I shared, is often ourselves—we tend to get in the way of God's work in our lives.

Thirty-one women participated in this Emmaus weekend, supported by more than fifty volunteers, myself included. It was an incredibly powerful time. The participants ranged in age from twenty-five to eighty-five, and from my vantage point, I witnessed a transformation in each of them. God's grace was palpable.

I've been involved in this movement since I was a teenager. In the Catholic and Episcopal churches, it's known as Cursillo; and in the Lutheran church, it's Via de Cristo. While the names and terminology may differ, the heart of the movement is the same. The Emmaus movement also has a teen version called Chrysalis. The Lutheran counterpart is Teens Encounter Christ (TEC). I attended my TEC weekend during my sophomore year of high school and later walked on my Via de Cristo weekend in the fall of 2015. Since then, I've served on countless weekends for TEC, Via de Cristo, and now Emmaus. It's a movement I deeply believe in and will continue to support.

As I've said many times before, growing churches have two common threads: their members attend spiritual weekends, and they are actively engaged in small groups—groups that pray together and read Scripture together.

Here are the upcoming Emmaus weekends:

- Men's Weekend: October 23–26
- Women's Weekend: November 6–9
- Chrysalis (High School Students): January 17–19

I've been asked to give a drop-in talk for the Men's weekend, so men—you'll have a chance to hear from me. I'll also be serving on the girls' side of the Chrysalis weekend in January (the boys and girls attend the same weekend but remain separated).

If you, your spouse, or your high school teen is interested, please reach out to me as soon as possible. I can help with the application and connect you with a sponsor (someone who has previously attended). Please note that each weekend has a maximum number of participants and a firm cut-off date for applications.

What I saw happen in the lives of those women this May—I want that for all of you. Several of us would be happy to answer your questions or share about our experience. The weekend isn't secretive, though there are a few surprises we like to keep. I hope many of you will consider attending one of these upcoming weekends.

Ah! It's time for another article for the parish Newsletter. Seems like that was just a couple weeks ago.

A question that has frequently come to me in my time here revolves around the way I present hymns for congregational singing. This is quite a fine question. In the Lutheran tradition, the congregation is very accustomed to singing. Musical literacy is very much a part of heritage of Luther and the Reformation. However, one must admit that there are various levels of musical literacy. Many have come into the tradition with little to no musical literacy. Liturgy by its very name requires participation by all gathered. The rhetorical issue then becomes or revolves a matter of hospitality. If a given hymn is either unknown or unfamiliar, simple playing through of the hymn before the congregation sings is very often all it takes to introduce the hymn to those who cannot read music, and those who need a little refamiliarization to participate. If I were writing in terms of the ministry of the usher, the word I would use is hospitality. Pedagogical literature on service playing supports this. Famed performer and teacher, Harold Gleason (Method of Organ Playing, p. 282) states as the first guideline to successful hymn playing "Processional hymns should preferably be played all the way through before singing..."

Council Corner

"Big L" and "Little l"

My doctoral dissertation was on the concept of creativity and how it impacts successful leaders. Through my research, I learned about "big C" and "little c" creativity. "Little c" is when we creatively come up with a new recipe, organize in a new manner, or create a beautiful poem. "Little c" moments make our lives sparkle and fill us with joy. "Big C" creativity is someone who creates new knowledge within a field of study, which is then added to historical keeping. We can all be creative in some manner. Is one type of creativity better or more important than the other? The short answer is no. They both have purpose and a place in our lives.

Regarding leadership, think about it in terms of "big L" and "little l" leaders. There is the mistaken belief that only the "big L" matters. "Big L" leaders have big titles and important positions that radiate impacts well beyond their sphere of influence. "Little l" leaders are those who quietly lead by example, not title, and use their influence and skills in a less formal manner to affect those directly around them. They step up when needed, if only temporarily. They are peer leaders, mentors, volunteers, someone who leads an event or even serves on a council. They make a huge difference where they are. "Big L" leaders are important, but we cannot live or function without a lot of "little l" leaders willing to make life better. No special skills required, just a desire and willingness to help others, not afraid to seek advice when needed and to always put God at the forefront of your decision making. Gloria Dei needs "little l's" of all kinds! Remember, "little l's" can be temporary, allowing you to grow and slowly gain confidence to more readily accept the next call for a leadership position.


Community Bible Study

That tragedy hits home one day when Flora disappears one day during a picnic near the River Thames. It's presumed that she drowned although a body is never found. As an adult, Hazel lives in London and works in a rare bookstore. She's been offered a job at Sotheby's and she's hoping her boyfriend will propose on an upcoming trip to Paris. On her last day at the bookstore, Hazel unwraps a book and discovers her world of Whisperwood illustrated and described in a book. Could Flora be the author? Hazel embarks on a mission, revisiting the past and looking for clues.

This one really kept me spellbound and I loved the style of writing. With dual storylines, the pacing was great and kept my interest. For me, this was a perfect mix of mystery, history, first love, and a compelling setting. I wasn't sure if Hazel would find her happy ever after ending, but it was a wonderful journey.




BRIGHTER FUTURES THROUGH EDUCATION

THE SITUATION

Education is the best path out of poverty. For every year a girl can stay in school, her earning potential as an adult soars by 20%. Yet poverty is the number one reason hundreds of millions of children globally do not attend school. In Sierra Leone, nearly 70% of women have no education at all—greatly limiting their earning potential and their ability to make informed decisions.



Half of 12- to 14-year-olds work 28+ hours a week





1 in 3 girls drops out of school by age 12 Both of 13-year-old Salamatu Conteh's parents are ill and can no longer care for her. This has put Salamatu at a higher risk of dropping out of school.

Luckily, her aunt and uncle were able to take her in and have made her education a priority, despite having four of their own children and limited resources.



With your incredible support, this year we launched a new pilot program to keep children — and especially girls — in school. We use **an innovative technology** to monitor school attendance, identify out-of-school girls, and provide monthly cash transfers so children can afford an education. Then we address non-financial barriers by connecting girls and their families with **health care**, **disability services**, **counseling and other support** so they can better care for themselves.


