The Fox's Trot

"And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

(Hebrews 10:24-25, NRSV).

The writer of Hebrews understood that Christian faith isn't meant to be lived in isolation. When we gather intentionally with our community of faith, something powerful happens that goes far beyond what we can experience alone.

Regular gathering creates the soil where deep Christian relationships can grow. When we see each other week after week, we move beyond surface pleasantries to genuine care and concern. These relationships become lifelines during difficult seasons—the friend who notices when you're absent, the family that brings meals during illness, the prayer partner who walks with you through grief. Sunday morning worship is beautiful, but it's in the consistency of gathering that we build the trust and intimacy that makes Christian community truly transformative.

For the past two or three years, I've led a Bible study every Wednesday at noon at our local homeless day center. When I arrive, folks are usually eating lunch or waiting for their meal. It's been challenging to connect since the community rotates in and out, though we have several regulars who've become familiar faces. What I've discovered is that after spending consistent time with them, they participate more in our studies and become more attentive to God's Word. One Wednesday stands out in my memory. I arrived alone—none of our usual church members could make it that day. As I set up for our study, one of the regulars said out loud, "Look, he comes here when there ain't no one else from his church. He's really

here for us." That moment reminded me that showing up consistently, regardless of who else comes, is what builds authentic Christian community. We listen to their needs, provide winter hats and blankets, share hygiene kits and snacks they can take with them. We're truly building community at the homeless day center—proof that Hebrews 10:24-25 works wherever people gather in Christ's name.

When we gather regularly, we grow together in ways that individual study and prayer cannot provide alone. We hear how God is working in different lives, learn from each other's insights into Scripture, and witness faith lived out in various circumstances. Bible studies, small groups, and fellowship meals become opportunities where we practice loving our neighbor and bearing each other's burdens. This shared growth strengthens the entire community and helps each of us mature in faith.

Christian community creates practical support networks that sustain us through life's challenges. When we know each other well through regular fellowship, we're positioned to offer real help when it's needed most. The retired teacher who offers tutoring, the carpenter who helps with repairs, the cook who organizes meal trains—these gifts emerge naturally from relationships built through consistent gathering. During the holidays and winter months, when isolation can feel especially heavy, these support networks become even more vital.

As we enter the busy holiday season and winter months, the temptation to skip gatherings grows stronger. But this is precisely when we need Christian community most. Make worship a priority, even when other obligations compete for your time. Consider joining a small group or Bible study, attend fellowship events, and participate in seasonal celebrations. Remember, you're not just receiving from community; you're contributing to it, and your presence matters more than you know.

Registration: Giving Each Hymn Its Own Voice

If you've ever noticed that some hymns sound grand and powerful while others seem delicate and prayerful, you've likely experienced the impact of registration. Registration is the organist's term for choosing which stops (or sounds) to use on the organ to suit the hymn.

The pipe organ is often called the "king of instruments" because of its vast range of voices. These voices come from different sets of pipes, each with its own character—some bright and trumpet-like, others soft and flute-like. The organist combines these voices by pulling stops, shaping the sound to fit the mood and message of each hymn.

Imagine the difference between "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" and "Be Still, My Soul." The first needs strong, bold sounds that affirm the hymn's message of strength and courage. The second calls for a gentler, more soothing tone. The organist's skill lies in finding just the right colors to paint the text musically.

Sometimes, the sound may change between verses to reflect different lines of the text. For instance, a quieter verse might be followed by one of triumph. A good organist will use registration changes to guide the congregation through these shifts, deepening the emotional and spiritual experience.

Choosing registrations isn't just about volume—it's about balance and clarity. The organ must be loud enough to support the singers but not so loud that it overwhelms them. It must blend with the congregation, allowing their voices to shine.

Even within one hymn, subtle shifts in sound can keep things fresh and engaging. A little variety can help draw attention to new ideas in the text or renew focus when attention might drift.

So next Sunday, pay attention to the organ's voice. Is it bold, bright, gentle, or warm? Chances are, the organist has thought carefully about how to support your singing—not just in words, but in sound. It's one more way the music of worship becomes both a personal and shared experience.

Gloria Dei Lutheran School is proud to offer quality child care for children ages 16 months through 12 years. This year, we are delighted to have 203 students enrolled in our program!

Our child care operates Monday through Friday, from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and is available during before- and after-school hours, parent/teacher conferences, staff workdays, and Christmas and Easter holidays. We also provide care on snow days (unless weather conditions are severe).

Children enjoy breakfast (served 6:15–7:15 a.m.), lunch, and both morning and afternoon snacks daily. Our program offers a variety of fun and engaging activities, including arts and crafts, movies, organized games, free play, and outdoor playtime.

For our older students, study hall is available for grades 3rd through 7th from 3:15 to 4:15 p.m. We also offer exciting after-school enrichment activities, such as gymnastics, Little Ninjas, Tumblebugz, Ninja Zone, art academy, and Lego Club.

Looking ahead, we're already preparing for Summer Adventures, our popular summer program for children ages 16 months to 12 years, beginning in June.

Our dedicated team works hard to provide a safe, nurturing, and engaging environment for all children in our care.

First Grade



We are having a wonderful year in First Grade! Over the past few months, our students have been busy learning new routines and building their independence—and the progress they've made is truly impressive.

We began the year focusing on sight words and phonics skills, laying the foundation for reading sentences and stories independently. In writing, students are learning to craft complete sentences and express their creativity. They're even sounding out words on their own to spell what they want to write—an exciting milestone!

In math, our First Graders have been hard at work developing essential skills. They've learned to count money, add and subtract, and follow multi-step directions. These skills are preparing them for upcoming challenges like telling time, double-digit math, and our newly introduced timed math drills.

We've also introduced grammar concepts that students will continue to build on throughout the year. And for the first time, they're learning what it means to receive grades for their work—an important step in their academic journey.

In early November, we took our first field trip to Holly Forks Farm. What an exciting way to celebrate the start of our second quarter.

We're off to a great start, and we're determined to make this year our best one yet!

Spanish Class

The students who attend Gloria Dei Lutheran School are fortunate to have the opportunity to take Spanish, and they will benefit from the many rewards that come from studying a foreign language. Spanish at Gloria Dei is taught to the elementary and the middle school students.

Spanish for the elementary students is an exposure class and they have it once a week. The students have been working very hard to learn Spanish and also to learn about Hispanic culture. Gloria Dei Lutheran School provides the Spanish classes with exciting learning materials enabling the Spanish curriculum to be rich and varied. This year, multiple books were purchased including *Me encantan las crías de animales* (I Love Baby Animals), *ÍSoy más grande que tú!* (I'm Bigger than You), *El gran libro de cuentos para ir a dormir* (The Big Book of bedtime stories).

The elementary students learned vocabulary words from the "Let's Learn Spanish" series by Hayes School Publishing Company. The purpose of this series is to encourage children to learn a foreign language while having fun.

In addition to learning vocabulary, the elementary students play games, listen to Hispanic music and dance, learn about Hispanic art, and study Hispanic culture and the geography of countries where Spanish is spoken.

Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) honors and remembers deceased friends and family. During fall festival week, the students learned about Day of the Dead. They viewed beautiful images of the holiday, listened to music regarding the holiday, and colored drawings inspired by Mexican folklore.

Spanish continues at Gloria Dei in the Middle School. The seventh and eighth grade Spanish classes are elective core courses and they are academically challenging. If the student completes Spanish 1A and 1B with success, he or she can earn high school credit. I am very proud of the students who have chosen to take these rigorous classes.

The middle school students also attended the festive Hispanic Flamenco Ballet performance of *Hispania*. This multicultural music and dance show was very colorful and entertaining.

All of the Spanish students will be learning more about Spanish language and culture, and I am fortunate to have the privilege of helping them to learn. As we approach Thanksgiving, let us be thankful for our many blessings, especially for the children in our lives.
